WHERE LIGHT BECOMES ART — THE LEGACY OF RENOIR

The International Prize Renoir – The Great Interpreter of Art is conceived as a tribute to one of the most luminous and influential figures in the history of art: Pierre-Auguste Renoir (1841–1919). A founding master of Impressionism, Renoir celebrated the joy of life through a painting rich in vibrant colors, light, and a profound sensitivity toward the human figure. From his origins in Limoges to his artistic maturity in Paris, his work transformed everyday life into poetic vision, making every moment timeless. His artistic journey was marked by continuous evolution. After participating in the first Impressionist exhibition in 1874, a journey to Italy led him toward a more solid and structured style, influenced by the harmony of the Renaissance. Even in his later years, despite being affected by severe arthritis, Renoir never stopped painting, demonstrating an absolute dedication to art. The bond between Renoir and the French Riviera—particularly Cagnes-sur-Mer, just a short distance from Cannes—was fundamental in the final phase of his life. Drawn by the mild climate and the extraordinary Mediterranean light, he found in this region a perfect synthesis between nature and art. That very light, a central element of his painting, still defines the visual identity of this territory today.

For this reason, Cannes has been chosen as the home of the International Prize Renoir. A city of extraordinary elegance and international appeal, it is globally renowned for hosting the prestigious Cannes Film Festival, a symbol of visual culture and contemporary imagination. Cannes represents a meeting point between art, spectacle, and creativity, where tradition and modernity continuously interact.

The relationship between Pierre-Auguste Renoir and cinema is indirect yet deeply meaningful, thanks to his son Jean Renoir, one of the greatest film directors in history. The father's painterly sensitivity—his attention to light, composition, and human emotion—profoundly influenced the cinematic language of his son, creating an ideal bridge between Impressionism and the seventh art. The International Prize Renoir – The Great Interpreter of Art is rooted in this legacy, celebrating artists capable of interpreting reality with sensitivity and vision, transforming light into emotion and art into a universal language. In the unique setting of Cannes, the prize affirms its international vocation, honoring a conception of art that continues to live, evolve, and inspire.



CELEBRATING TRUE TALENT: CANNES AS A STAGE FOR ART: THE INTERNATIONAL PRIZE RENOIR

On September 12, 2026, at the prestigious *The California Conference Hall – Juliana Cannes Hotel*, the official award ceremony of the *International Prize Renoir – The Great Interpreter of Art* will take place, an event of international significance dedicated to the promotion and recognition of contemporary artistic excellence. Set within an elegant and exclusive environment, in the heart of Cannes' refined atmosphere—a city that stands as a symbol of visual culture and global imagination—the awards will be presented to the selected artists. These artists represent paths of research and experimentation capable of interpreting the universal values of art through a contemporary lens.

The choice of Cannes as the venue highlights the intention to position the prize within a highly prestigious setting, a crossroads of artistic languages and a meeting point between tradition and innovation.
